Time to sit down, take a breath and tell a tale. Recovery: where would I be without it? Ten years ago this month I heard the message of AA from a mental ward in Caldwell, Idaho... I was so very, very sick. I hit my bottom and I was ready to leave the planet. Now mind you, I had been in Adult Children of Alcoholics at it's earliest inception in the early 80's. It was easy to say I was an adult child of an alcoholic, of that I was sure. Ingrained in my DNA are the traits I learned while dissociating from my family trauma of growing up in a war zone called the alcoholic home. I learned to not trust, not believe what I know I saw, how to rise to the top in a crisis and of course never ever talk about what happened or how it made you feel.... And, by God, you better look good when you left the house to present a good fake front. Survival skills that I have honed and utilized my entire life.

So, coming into AA late in my life I had an awful lot to learn. I was grateful that the compulsion to drink had been removed and that I found another woman that would give her experience strength and hope to me for fun and for free. Of course... that was after I fired several sponsors... because... well, they pissed me off. I was so angry and sad when I got to AA. All I did was spit nails and cry... for years. It wasn 't until I completed the steps... you know, all the way through... that my life began to change. Some of us are sicker than others and I am one of those folks. So I have taken full advantage of our sister programs that are helping me immensely. There is no way I could have done any of our sister programs without AA first. I had to put the plug in the jug and get real with myself. No easy task. How the women in my recovery ever put up with me I will never know. But, I would get invited to backyards, picnics and then someone asked me to make coffee for the meeting. AA included me before I included myself in the program. I will be forever grateful for being allowed to be real and release years of pent up anger and self-hatred that kept me drunk for over 50 years.

We all have our experience and we all heal at different time speeds. The miracle is that I lived to tell this story.

So many things I would have missed had my initial plan worked. Spirit is intricately woven in my DNA as well. My connection to my higher power has morphed over the last 10 years to something I can not even put into words, so I will not even try. Spirit is or isn't. Choose wisely.

We have all had our experience with the covid dread... zoom... masks... etc. I am so happy I was able to go to a live meeting and see a new face walk in the room. She was down and shared that she was down. After the meeting I approached her and we went to lunch. I was giddy with joy at being able to meet a (Continued next page)

new face and talk face-to-face with another alcoholic!!!! A little needy for a friend myself and human contact... you don't get that on zoom. For, what I have learned in recovery is: the only help I can give is to another alcoholic who is willing. Period. ...and guess what? It helps me as well. My new friend and I attended the District 10 campout last weekend at Elk Flat campground. Now I have been back and forth to Pocatello and Boise a bazillion times... but I have never turned left at Mountain Home for any reason except for a pit stop at the gas station. So my new friend and I were off to unknown areas of Idaho... are you laughing yet? Anderson reservoir is no secret in this valley... but to me it was a great adventure. We found the campsite... it was late when we pulled in. Set up my tent and my friend had her truck. In the morning we saw that the site we were in was reserved for someone other than the District 10 campout. We were welcomed by the folks in AA bright and early in the morning and they told us they would help us move our campsite if the other folks showed up. Just like that... go into unknown regions... meet new folks in recovery and you have instant friends who are willing to help you break camp. We had a great time... the river is right there... and Trinity Hot Springs... oh my what a find!!! Great food, great conversations and lots and lots of full belly laughs. I have discovered I need a taller tent... no more crawling in for this old girl and I will never be able to afford an RV... so tent camping it is. I don't even have to put on a fake front... no make up allowed in camping... just walk out the door and be accepted just like that. Come as you are and you might learn a thing or two. Who knew that

if you took a chance and turned left, instead of doing what you always did over and over and over, with a new friend at the wheel... both willing to go the distance in the dark to the light and the left... what treasures were waiting for you! A new life with a whole new outlook on absolutely everything! So very

grateful for the journey and all the folks I have met along the way!

**1.** If you know the full name and the mailing address of the recipient: Give a Gift Subscription to a friend, a sponsee, doctor's offices, or for giveaways at anniversaries or events at your homegroup, district, or area level.

#### Follow these steps:

Go to store.aagrapevine.org.

- Click on the Gift Subscriptions box.
- Click on the Red Gift Bag icon for the type of gift subscription you want to give.
- Click on "Go to the products page."
- Click on the number of Gift subscriptions you want to purchase (1 gift or 2).
- Enter your information, the recipient's information, and your payment information.
- Click on the Process Order button. You're done!

Note: First renewal notices will be sent to you and if there is no response, the last ones will be sent to the recipient.

2. If you do not know the full name and the mailing address of the recipient and want Grapevine to select an alcoholic in need from the requests we have received: Give a Carry the Message Gift Certificate to someone you do not know (such as an alcoholic in prison.)

#### Follow these steps:

Go to store.aagrapevine.org.

- Click on the Gift Certificate box.
- Click the Buy button of the appropriate Carry the Message Gift Certificate option and you will be taken to a page showing our quantity discounts (at the bottom).
- Enter the number of gift certificates that you want and click the Buy button. (For multiple gift certificates, the discount will automatically be applied).
- Click Checkout and enter your order and payment information.
- When you click the Confirm button, you will get an order confirmation email and the gift certificate will be sent to you as an individual email. Forward the gift certificate to <u>Sonia Dominguez</u> at <u>sdominguez@aagrapevine.org</u> and we will redeem it for someone who has requested a subscription but can't afford one. (If you have purchased multiple gift certificates, select all of them and use the Forward as Attachment option, so you only have to send us one email).

**Note:** Your information will not be connected to the subscription record and all renewal notices will be sent directly to the recipient.



### General Service Conference (G.S.C.) Proposed Agenda Item Submission Form

#### Annual deadline for submissions for a General Service Conference is September 15".

What types of proposals, suggestions or ideas rise to the level of needing a General Service Conference "action" or "decision"?

Proposals that are important to the future of Alcoholics Anonymous, policy decisions or request for changes to Conference-approved literature and items that might require the collective conscience of the Fellowship. The trustees, corporate directors and staff bring together years of experience in A.A. service in making decisions about the appropriate process or disposition of proposed Conference agenda items. Warranty six reminds us "that though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government..." The A.A. Service Manual/Twelve Concepts for World Service page 72.

The A.A. Service Manual/Twelve Concepts for World Service states on page S57 that:

The final agenda for any Conference consists of items suggested by individual A.A. members, groups, delegates, trustees, area assemblies, area committee members, and directors and staff members of A.A.W.S. and the Grapevine. The Conference considers matters of policy for A.A. as a whole, and there are tried-and-true procedures for placing an item on the agenda in the most effective way — or, when the suggestion does not concern overall policy, for routing it to the most appropriate part of the service structure.

If a G.S.R. has an idea for an agenda item, chances are that he or she will want to discuss it first with the group, then at a district or area meeting, which can then forward it to the staff member at G.S.O. currently serving as Conference coordinator. An A.A. who is not part of the general service structure can give the idea to the group's G.S.R. or write directly to the Conference coordinator.

The following is from a process overview document "FAQs on Group Conscience Consideration for Proposed Conference Agenda Items."

- Q. What happens when a proposed Conference agenda item arrives at the Conference Coordinator's desk?
- A. The Conference Coordinator acknowledges receipt of the proposed agenda item and lets the sender know which of the following options is most appropriate and, if necessary, an explanation of why and how the proposed agenda item is being directed. Some of the possible routes are:
  - Forwarding to a Trustees' Committee via a G.S.O. Staff Member or Department Head.
  - Forwarding to G.S.O.'s Publications Director or Group Services Staff person.
  - Forwarding to A.A. World Services, Inc.
  - 4. Forwarding to Chair of the General Service Board.
  - Forwarding to the A.A. Grapevine Corporate Board/AA Grapevine Publisher.
- Q. What happens when it is unclear what committee should address a proposed item or where an item should be routed?
- A. When it is unclear where a proposed item belongs, it is most frequently forwarded to the trustees' Committee on the Conference for direction.

If a proposed agenda item does not rise to the level of a Conference action the topic could be programmed during Conference in a different way like a presentation/discussion or workshop.

This overview is general and includes many but not necessarily all the possible routes a proposed agenda item follows in the trustee, G.S.O. and Grapevine review process. There is no "one size fits all" procedure and, on a case-by-case basis over time, there may occasionally be inconsistencies.
