"To Carry This Message To Alcoholics And To Practice These Principles In All Our Affairs"

"Honey, why do you drink like that? Why can't you just have a few and come home? Why do you have to get drunk?" The raw anguish in my wife's voice cut into my consciousness like a hot knife. It was the same question I had heard over and over through the drinking episodes I had splattered like rotten tomatoes across the two decades of our marriage. And my answer was just the same as it had always been: "I just the first time that kind don't know. I'm so sorry but I just don't know." "I just feel like I'm lost, like I've lost my way and am in the wilderness somewhere and can't seem to find my way back." I uttered were a typical part of those words to my loving wife on a Saturday morning in July 1982 as I tried desperately to explain why I had stopped after work for a casional hard liquor couple of beers the night before but ended

up eight hours later sitting drunk outside a bar in Bossier City, Louisiana, waiting for her to come take me home. It has been a long time now since I spoke those tortured – but brutally honest – words that came from some dark reservoir of anguish, self-loathing and remorse that had filled my insides. But I can remember the moment as if it were yesterday – and it still gives me a sick feeling. It wasn't of incident had happened. My periodic binges of drinking had begun when I was in my early teens living in a small town in country Idaho. At first, they the experience of growing up in a small rural town: underage teens getting drunk on weekends on beer or the ocsupplied by an indulgent adult. In my case

the occasional drunken binges continued through the final three years of high school. Even then the frequently lengthy periods of abstinence somehow disguised the real problem. Once I took the first drink, I wouldn't stop until something outside of me intervened. Only when I sobered up would I realize and then doing it again the wreckage I had created. Then I would find myself begging forgiveness from my parents, pledging to never do it again and trying to explain why I had drunk myself into an alcoholic stupor, why my personality when I was drunk was totally different that when I was sober. Today I know it was the classic Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde alcoholic behavior I have learned about in the AA program. Back then, it just seems like I had no real will

power. If only I had

known, it was just the beginning of 25 years of ever more frequent episodes of alcoholic drinking. I cannot count the number of times my sprees ended after I had disgraced myself and humiliated my family. Begging my wife and children to forgive me, making solemn promises to never do it again became a dreaded intervention in our otherwise normal family and work life. As time passed, the intervals began to become closer together and repeated instances of terrible immoral behavior were added to the mix of wreckage I brought down upon those I loved. And yet through it all, I simply could not answer the simple question my wife begged me to answer: Why? With years of failure to stop drinking as evidence, I the only explanation I could come up with was

that the things that good, moral people are born with had been left out of me. The resulting despair I felt left me contemplating suicide for the first time in my life. My alcohol problem was shielded from my understanding by the façade that I had built to house it. I had suffered none of the outward signs that often identify people as having an alcohol problem. I never lost a job, was seemingly happily married with two wonderful daughters. I had never been arrested – although I risked it by adding marijuana to the mix a couple of rection. It hasn't been easy. At times and should have been arrested more times than I can count for drunken driving. My job never suffered, and my career path was always upwards. I had the things that good, moral people are born with had been left out of me. The resulting despair I felt left me contemplating suicide for the first time in my life. job never suffered, and my career path was always upwards. I had With the help of my higher power and others in the program I have forged a new way of living based on AA program principles. I have attempted to clean up the wreckage of my alcoholic past by making direct amends where I could and by making (and continuing to make) living amends where they were more appropriate. Along the way that big bag of self-loathing and remorse has dwindled to an occasional 10th step mid-course cortimes I think I have failed more times than my ego will permit me to say, but I keep trying. After all, isn't it progress, not perfection? Some of us are just slower than others. One thing I do know for certain is that as long as I don't drink and keep trying, I have a chance. In return I have been given a life beyond anything I could have ever dreamed. Not in material things, but in the love of my family. My beloved wife and I last June celebrated our 58th wedding anniversary. I have found in her a love greater than any I could have dreamed possible. I'll make an embarrassing confession here: In the beginning, I always wondered if Bill W's hospital room spiritual experience really did happen the way it is described. I no long need to wonder. I know now that mine

happened to me in the front seat of my car on a Saturday morning in July 1982. No smoke, no wind blowing through me, no feeling of calm and serenity. Just a moment in which I spoke aloud the answer to the question that I could never answer before. Why did I drink the way I did? Because my name is Dick, and I am an alcoholic.

18 miles north on Highway 21 from Boise. Turn right onto Road #268/Arrowrock Road for 4.5 miles.








