From the Editor's Desk...

A great big Kudos goes out to Jason S. for serving as the editor for this Intergroup Newsletter for the past three years! Thank you, Jason! We appreciate your time and commitment to service!

In March of 2020, our Treasure Valley Intergroup was just one of the many Intergroups across the nation impacted by the Coronal Virus pandemic. All of a sudden the world stopped. Our local AA meeting places locked their doors and our Central Office was inundated with Zoom Meeting information on a daily, constant basis as our Groups moved to Online meeting formats with ID Numbers and passwords that seemed to change by the hour! TVICO worked "beyond the call of duty" to ensure that an accurate meeting list was maintained online for all the groups. Our TVICO Trusted Servants even kept the office open 2 hours a day, for 2 days a week, to be available for any newcomer questions, or for groups to pick-up supplies.... all the while following CDC guidelines of mandatory masks. This was a demonstration of Service in Action, for Intergroup offices are usually the first place a newcomer calls for AA help and information. During this time, the AA Hotline calls arose 300 percent, and remained OPEN at all times, due to our TVICO and our Hotline volunteers! In addition, our TVICO found an innovative and creative way to reach the newcomer through Virtual meetings... the Glide App.! Yes, a Glide App. was created called, "AA Literature" in which our local groups can share in their Virtual chat rooms virtual Newcomer Packets for Newcomers! The link is: https://chief-stream-5535.glideapp.io/ This App also gives access to the AA Big Book, the AA 12x12, AA Pamphlets, and even AA.Org AA Guidelines! What a service this is for all the groups online, and everyone, actually!

During the pandemic, Intergroup had to cancel most "Unity" events. However, throughout the past year Intergroup continued to meet monthly via Zoom to conduct business virtually. Thank you to all Intergroup Representatives who continued (and continue) to participate throughout the past several months!

Elections are coming up soon, so let's review exactly what Intergroup and TVICO do, shall we?

From Group Pamphlet page 38: "An intergroup or central office is a vital A.A. service office that represents a partnership among groups in a community — just as A.A. groups themselves are a partnership of individuals. These offices are established to carry out common functions that are best handled by a centralized office, and it is usually maintained, supervised and supported by these groups for their common interest. The office exists to aid the groups in carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers. Methods and goals vary from one area to another, but generally the intergroup or central office responsibility is to... Cooperate with local, district and area committees. (Some intergroups elect members to serve as area liaisons and welcome their participation in intergroup meetings.)" (Our local Intergroup/TVICO elects District liaisons) "Your intergroup, or central office, is often where the still-suffering alcoholic first calls or shows up for A.A. help. Although local intergroups operate independently of A.A.'s worldwide service structure, they are a vital part of the Fellowship. In most areas, any group that so wishes can belong to the local intergroup, which is supported by contributions from its member groups. These contributions are purely voluntary."

From the GSO A.A. Guidelines: "Central or Intergroup Offices": "Each group in the community is asked to send both a representative and an alternate representative to a special meeting to form a central/intergroup office committee (also called a steering committee in some places). Local group representatives reflect the groups' conscience in the service center operations (Central Office). In most communities, a central/intergroup office committee or steering committee is set up to handle the administrative activities of the service office. The steering committee holds regularly scheduled meetings and deals with general policy and plans. Periodically, the steering committee reports to group representatives on central/intergroup office problems and accomplishments. It is extremely important to keep a two-way flow of information going between the central/intergroup office and groups. ...the committee (Intergroup) takes over the responsibility for the project and outlines its aims and purposes for approval by the participating groups. Service centers (Central Offices) usually have no authority on their own account; they derive it from the participating groups." (Hence, our local Intergroup, composed of Group Reps., established a "Steering Committee" to oversee the operations of TVICO) "Central/intergroup offices are essentially A.A. service entities, 'directly responsible to those they serve,' as described in Tradition Nine."

The current Intergroup/TVICO bylaws state: "The name of the corporation is Treasure Valley Intergroup Office of Alcoholics Anonymous Inc. (hereinafter "Intergroup") located in the Greater Treasure Valley, an organization exempt from income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. The Treasure Valley Intergroup Central Office (hereinafter "TVICO") is a nonprofit retail store. The purpose of the TVICO Steering Committee serves as a subcommittee to Intergroup and responsible to Intergroup for the operation of TVICO. ...a. All District AA groups are eligible to send one (1) individual to participate in the monthly Intergroup Meetings. b. Each representative will have one (1) vote. a. Each District is asked to submit a nominee to be elected as the District Representative to the TVICO Steering Committee by Intergroup. The purpose of INTERGROUP shall include: a. Fostering and encouraging AA unity and cooperation among Idaho Area 18 AA Groups and to raise funds to provide for the viability of a Central Office. b. Guiding the operation of TVICO through its subcommittee known as the TVICO Steering Committee. c. Furthering the AA program in accordance with the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous. d. Providing a 24-hour hotline Answering Service. e. Publishing a monthly newsletter. f. Maintaining a list of volunteers to accept 12-Step calls. The purpose of the TVICO Steering Committee shall include: a. Providing goods and services to the groups and individuals such as General Service Office (GSO) literature, recovery literature, answering service, and accurate meeting schedules. b. Furthering the AA program in accordance with the Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous. d. Handling all AA Hotline calls during normal operating hours. e. Aiding Intergroup in the publishing of a monthly newsletter. f. Fostering and encouraging AA unity and cooperation among Idaho Area 18 AA Groups. g. As needed, responsible for developing policies and procedures for TVICO. h. Responsible for all employment matters relating to TVICO."

As you can see, Intergroup and Central Office provide an integral element to the Treasure Valley AA Community by providing many services to help us all "carry the message". Would you like to be a "part of" to enhance your quality of sobriety? You are needed! Watching our local TVICO operate during a catastrophic event like a pandemic, step-up to ensure that the newcomer needing the AA message, found it, and watching all of our groups respond and adapt to a new way of meeting online – all this is evidence that being of "maximum usefulness to others" has not only kept us sober and unified, but has also introduced newcomers to our program who have achieved and maintained sobriety during this time. This is what it's about!

So, please consider serving as either an Intergroup Representative for your group, or as a District TVICO Liaison at District level! If interested in being District Representative, please find the District Business meeting date listed on page 14 of this newsletter, show-up at the August business meeting and let them know you are interested in serving for their District at TVICO! Also, the next Intergroup Meeting is Thursday, August 12! Everyone is invited to attend!

Beginning June 15th, with the July issue of the Online Grapevine, the AA Preamble revision that was passed at this year's General Service Conference will be seen in print! The preamble revision replaces the words "men and women" with "people". Going forward, the language will change wherever the Preamble appears.

The Idaho Area 18 Committee voted to move forward with an **In-Person Fall Assembly** scheduled for October 1-3 at the Burley Inn and Convention Center... with a stipulation, however... At the special Area Committee Meeting on June 19th, David F. proposed a "stop loss" agreement; that we need **75 paid registrations including Saturday Banquet & Sunday Breakfast by August 15th.** If this pre-registration is not achieved by Aug 15th, then the convention will be canceled, and full refunds will be returned by August 30th. This proposal is to ensure fiscal responsibility for covering the meeting room agreement and to cover the cost of hosting Pacific Region Trustee, Kathy F. as Speaker. Now, should we fail to achieve the 75 paid registrations by August 15, the Assembly will be held via Zoom. So there you have it folks! This is an Election Assembly! It will be exciting! DRUNKS

We died of pneumonia in furnished rooms where they found us three days later when somebody complained about the smell. We died against bridge abutments and nobody knew if it was suicide and we probably didn't know either except in the sense that it was always suicide. We died in hospitals our stomachs huge, distended and there was nothing they could do. We died in cells never knowing whether we were guilty or not. We went to priests they gave us pledges they told us to pray they told us to go and sin no more, but go we tried and we died. We died of overdoses. We died in bed (but usually not the Big Bed). We died in straitjackets in the DTs seeing God knows what creeping skittering slithering shuffling things.

And you know what the worst thing was? The worst thing was that nobody ever believed how hard we tried.

We went to doctors and they gave us stuff to take that would make us sick when we drank on the principle of so crazy, it just might work, I guess or maybe they just shook their heads and sent us places like Dropkick Murphy's and when we got out we were hooked on paraldehyde or maybe we lied to the doctors and they told us not to drink so much just drink like me and we tried and we died. We drowned in our own vomit or choked on it our broken jaws wired shut. We died playing Russian roulette and people thought we'd lost but we knew better. We died under the hoofs of horses under the wheels of vehicles under the knives and boot-heels of our brother drunks. We died in shame.

And you know what was even worse? Was that we couldn't believe it ourselves that we had tried we figured we just thought we tried and we died believing that we hadn't tried believing that we didn't know what it meant to try.

When we were desperate enough or hopeful or deluded or embattled enough to go for help we went to people with letters after their names and prayed that they might have read the right books that had the right words in them never suspecting the terrifying truth that the right words, as simple as they were had not been written yet. We died falling off girders on high buildings because of course ironworkers drink of course they do. We died with a shotgun in our mouth or jumping off a bridge and everybody knew it was suicide. We died under the Southeast Expressway with our hands tied behind us and a bullet in the back of our head because this time the people that we disappointed were the wrong people. We died in convulsions, or of "insult to the brain". We died incontinent, and in disgrace, abandoned. If we were women, we died degraded, because women have so much more to live up to. We tried and we died and nobody cried.

And the very worst thing was that for every one of us that died there were another hundred of us, or another thousand who wished that we would die who went to sleep praying we would not have to wake up because what we were enduring was intolerable and we knew in our hearts it wasn't ever gonna change.

One day in a hospital room in New York City one of us had what the books call "a transforming spiritual experience" and he said to himself I've got it (no you haven't you've only got part of it) and I have to share it (now you've ALMOST got it) And he kept trying to give it away but we couldn't hear it the transmission line wasn't open yet we tried to hear it we tried and we died. We died of one last cigarette the comfort of its glowing in the dark we passed out and the bed caught fire they said we suffocated before our body burned they said we never felt a thing that was the best way maybe that we died except sometimes we took our family with us. And the man in New York was so sure he had it he tried to love us into sobriety but that didn't work either, love confuses drunks and he tried and still we died. One after another we got his hopes up and we broke his heart because that's what we do.

And the very worst thing of all was that every time we thought we knew what the worst thing was something happened that was even worse.

Until a day came in a hotel lobby and it wasn't in Rome, or Jerusalem, or Mecca or even Dublin, or South Boston it was in Akron, Ohio, for Christ's sake. A day came when the man said I have to find a drunk because I need him as much as he needs me (NOW you've got it) And the transmission line after all those years was open.
