

Step Eight—Freedom

I was hesitant and puzzled when I began my Eight Step list because what about people whose feelings might be hurt or might harmed if I admitted all—my Step Four inventory had several of those. Luckily, my sponsor informed me that Step Eight is not Step Nine, and I should not leave these activities off my list. But obviously, this did not mean that I make these harmful amends while doing Step Nine. This information may be useful in asking God for forgiveness in a later step.



My Eighth Step information came mostly from my Step four inventory, but also my sponsor had me do a spontaneous writing earlier on. This included asking God over and Again to reveal where I had been selfish and dishonest—not just from regular memory, but from my deepest inner self. **Spontaneous!** This function brought to light many secrets I had kept from myself for many years. They needed to be written down!

I had seldom even considered the anguish my wonderful Christian parents must have felt to see their son's name in the newspaper for public intoxication year after year. Or my younger sister who, four years later, attended the same high school with my devil may care reputation still remembered by the teachers. I had never felt guilty about that loan company I had never paid back or the time when I, as a teen, tried out a motorcycle from a used a lot and wrecked it. I was able to wobble it in and jumped on my bicycle and away I went.

There was a temptation to leave out certain of my misbehaviors because, after all, I had been sober for five whole months, and intended *never to drink whisky again!* I was obviously now in the category of what is called "living amends!" How my sponsor pointed out that the Big Book makes no mention of "living amends;" it actually dispels that idea at the bottom of page 82—"Ain't it grand the wind stopped blowin?"

I believe the honesty revealed in my Eighth Step list was a vital an crucial part of my recovery. Bob S. Our Idaho 18 Area Archives has Service opportunities. We need assistance in updating our Home Group Histories. Our local history was last collected, organized and printed during our 50th Anniversary in 1995. It's time we add our experience, strength and hope, our place in A.A. history.

Researching A.A. — Group History

How do Home Groups write their group history? Listed below are some typical questions that the Archives Department use. It is suggested that members try to answer as many of these questions as they are able. Please return histories to the email or street address listed below on or before the next Area Committee Meeting held on Sunday, August 21, 2022.

- 1. What year was the group formed?
- 2. What is the group's current name and District number?
- 3. Have there been any changes to the group's name over the years?
- 4. Who were the founding members of the group?
- 5. Who were the early group officers? List, for example, GSR, Group Contact, Chair, Group Secretary, etc.
- 6. Where and when was the first meeting held? In date order, list where later meetings were held. Include city, state.
- 7. Did the group list with the General Service Office at the time the members first met?
- 8. What initiated the meeting? Was it the offshoot of a parent group, was there a split due to disagreements, did a few A.A.s simply decide to start a hometown group, etc.?
- 9. How did the founding members let the community know that a new A.A. meeting was forming?
- 10. How many members attended the group's first meeting?
- 11. Describe membership composition, for example, men only, women, young people, etc.
- 12. Are group inventories conducted regularly, and have they been helpful and how?
- 13. Has the group used a steering committee? If so, for what purpose and what was the outcome?
- 14. What meeting formats are used and has that changed over the years? closed, open, discussion, etc.
- 15. Does your group hold virtual and in-person meetings?
- 16. How did the group navigate growing pains, worldly controversies, natural disasters, or global health crisis, etc.?
- 17. How does the group celebrate group member's anniversaries of sobriety?
- 18. How has the group celebrated the anniversary of its' founding?
- 19. Describe how the group has cooperated with professional agencies (by signing court cards, supporting a meeting in an institutional setting, taking calls for a local or Intergroup hotline, or participated in the General Service Structure.
- 20. Has the group participated in special local or regional A.A. functions, such as Conventions Central Office, Conferences, Roundups, Forums or Workshops?
- 21. Does the group have a website, or Facebook type page?

- 22. How does your group communicate information?
- 23. Does the group have anonymity protected minutes or recordings of its meetings?
- 24. Does the group have anonymity protected recordings/minutes of its history?
- 25. Does the group have memorabilia: buttons, newspaper articles, photographs of meeting locations, members and events?
- 26.Please supply a phone number and or email of someone willing to be contacted for any follow-up questions regarding the above home group information.

Alcoholics Anonymous and the Value of an Informed Group Conscience

What does it mean when we use the words: "Informed Group Conscience" in A.A.? Well, it begins with Tradition Two which states: "For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority - a loving God as he may express himself in our Group Conscience. Our leaders are but Trusted Servants they do not govern.

A Group Conscience is the collective conscience of the group membership. Sometimes these can occur quickly with immediate on-the-spot motions, and a majority vote, usually based on whose voice can gain the majority agreement. This is used for simple and or routine decisions.

An INFORMED Group Conscience is also a collective conscience of group membership, however is used for issues that are controversial or complex and also implies that all pertinent information for the topic is identified, presented, reviewed, and AA principles, Traditions, Concepts, and when necessary legal instruments like Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation, and State Regulations have all been consulted and discussed before a vote is taken.

This is a slow process. The minority opinion is heard with open-mindedness. Instead of a majority vote - the result of an INFORMED group conscience is substantial unanimity and a feeling of common agreement . . . a spiritual bond is formed and everyone accepts the results of the vote leaving everyone wanting to move into the direction of the decision because the process of arriving at an Informed Group Conscience was honored. This process creates Unity.

So, sometimes a Group Conscience is arrived at for real quick decisions, like "can we purchase 12 oz. cups instead of 8 oz. cups?" Then there are Major Policy decisions that need to be made. Yes, in A.A., each groups is autonomous "except in matters affecting A.A. as a whole."

But how do we discern which decisions will "affect A.A. as a whole?" When it comes to our General Service work, of course Bill W. of has an answer! In his "A.A.'s Legacy of Service", he says: "Our 12th Step - Carry the Message - is the basic service that the A.A. Fellowship gives; this is our principle aim and the main reason for our existence . . . Concerning any given service, we therefore pose but one question: 'Is this service really needed?' If it is, then maintain it we must, or fail in our mission to those who need and seek A.A."

Sometimes, yes, sometimes, as much as I love Service in Alcoholics Anonymous, I must say, it is not fun to go through the process of presenting information, facts, guidelines, or non-profit corporation law. Others do not always want to hear it. It is not fun, but it needs to be done... for the future generations of AA, and the Alcoholic not yet born. Seeing my dad and my brother die of this disease, the "not fun" parts are totally, totally worth the investment of the value of an Informed Group Conscience.

I would invite us all to take a deep breath and consider the value of an Informed Group Conscience in the next few months


