A. A. Reunites Two 'Drunks,' Both Sober

Six years ago, in Japan, before he joined A.A., Roy and another heavy-drinking sergeant became close friends. The two became separated until, about a year ago, the sergeant was assigned to Roy's base but the men did not meet. Several months ago, the sergeant, now in A.A., wrote to G.S.H. for an A.A. contact on the base.

"So here we are," Roy writes, "Old friends who met again through A.A. I think that's one for the books." And so do we.

From Leighton D., whose plight should enlist the sympathy of at least a few readers:

I am a Loner up here on the North Arctic Coast of Alaska, an I.T.&T. Corporation employee on the Dew (Distant Early Warning) Line. I was at Point Barrow, Alaska for a few weeks where I met several times with the small group there but, I was transferred a few short weeks after arriving, and am now on the barren coast of Alaska. I have a 2,200 mile line in which I work back and forth, never being in one place more than three months. I have been here three months now and have been stationed at three stations. At the present time I am at a place called Icy Cape and plan on being here until early in September. There are no other A.A.s on the line. In fact I think I am the only one out of 750 employees. I suppose I need not tell you there's plenty of temptation and opportunity to imbibe here but I've been safe so far. I believe if I had a few active A.A.s to write to I would be more at ease. I will appreciate any help you may give me on this matter. I was (and still am, I hope) a Chicago member of Avalon #2 Group, on the South side of Chicago.

The following night had supper at Jack's home, and then another meeting. Jack has been sober nine months and doing fine. Pat and Jess have a wonderful understanding of A. A. The work they do with A. A. and the Alcoholic Information Center is enormous. They have just completed a month's tour of the Union, speaking on alcoholism. I am now looking forward to meetings in Durban and Port Elizabeth.

- ♦ Click on the Red Gift Bag icon for the type of gift subscription you want to give.
- ♦ Click on "Go to the products page."
- ♦ Click on the number of Gift subscriptions you want to purchase (*1 gift or 2*).
- ♦ Enter your information, the recipient's information, and your payment information.
- ♦ Click on the Process Order button. You're done!
- ♦ **Note:** First renewal notices will be sent to you and if there is no response, the last ones will be sent to the recipient.

2. If you do not know the full name and the mailing address of the recipient and want Grapevine to select an alcoholic in need from the requests we have received: Give a Carry the Message Gift Certificate to someone you do not know (*such as an alcoholic in prison.*)

Follow these steps:

- ♦ Go to store.aagrapevine.org.
- ♦ Click on the Gift Certificate box.
- ♦ Click the Buy button of the appropriate Carry the Message Gift Certificate option and you will be taken to a page showing our quantity discounts (*at the bottom*).
- ♦ Enter the number of gift certificates that you want and click the Buy button. (*For multiple gift certificates, the discount will automatically be applied*).
- ♦ Click Checkout and enter your order and payment information.
- ♦ When you click the Confirm button, you will get an order confirmation email and the gift certificate will be sent to you as an individual email. Forward the gift certificate to [Sonia Dominguez](mailto:sdominguez@aagrapevine.org) at sdominguez@aagrapevine.org and we will redeem it for someone who has requested a subscription but can't afford one. (*If you have purchased multiple gift certificates, select all of them and use the Forward as Attachment option, so you only have to send us one email*).
- ♦ **Note:** Your information will not be connected to the subscription record and all renewal notices will be sent directly to the recipient.
