





Understanding Alcoholics Anonymous and Spirituality

A.A. welcomes anyone seeking help for a drinking problem and is not aligned with any religious tradition or beliefs.

(NEW YORK, August 15, 2023)

Since the founding of Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.) in 1935, members of all faiths, beliefs, and traditions have found common ground in and benefited from the A.A. program of recovery. The A.A. fellowship has grown and expanded around the world, reaching people of all backgrounds, beliefs, and religious traditions who have found help and hope in the A.A. spiritual program as embodied in its Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions.

It is a common misconception that Alcoholics Anonymous is a religious-based or Christian organization, but that is not the case. In fact, a fundamental principle of A.A. is that the Fellowship is not affiliated with any religion, nor is it allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization, or institution. As stated in the A.A. Preamble, which is read at most local A.A. meetings, "The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. ... Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety." Thus, A.A. members need not hold any sort of religious or A.A.-defined spiritual beliefs to find help for their drinking. Each person determines their own pathway in their recovery from alcoholism.

At A.A. meetings, spiritual themes are often highlighted in members' personal sharing, or in readings at meetings from the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions or the book Alcoholics Anonymous—commonly called "The Big Book." But while there may be references to "God" and "higher power" in A.A. literature and at meetings, the essence of the A.A. program is one alcoholic helping another. Members find they can get and stay sober when they look for a power greater than themselves for help, which is part of the A.A. program, whether that be a god, spiritual principles, nature, or the fellowship itself. There is complete freedom for each person to determine these matters.

As stated in the A.A. pamphlet "The 'God' Word: Agnostic and Atheist Members in A.A.":

There is room in A.A. for people of all shades of belief and non-belief. Many members believe in some sort of god, and we have members who come from and practice all sorts of religions, but many are also atheist or agnostic. It's important to remember that A.A. is not a religious organization; we have a simple idea that there is a power greater than us as individuals. What we all have in common is that the program helps us find an inner strength that we were previously unaware of — where we differ is in how we identify the source.

More information about this topic and A.A. is available at <u>aa.org</u>. In addition to <u>"The</u> 'God' Word" pamphlet, A.A. literature also includes the pamphlet "<u>Many Paths to Spirituality</u>" as well as the chapter "We Agnostics" in the Big Book.

What is Treasure Valley Intergroup Office of Alcoholics Anonymous Inc.?



These events were created to foster Unity within the A.A. community and also raised funds for the viability of the Central Office.

The past few years, since the onset of the COVID-19 virus such Unity activities have been halted for the safety of our fellowship. In 2023, things are beginning to change and Intergroup is in the process of planning fun fellowship events soon! Intergroup continues to have monthly meetings to keep our local Central Office viable and to continue to foster Unity and to carry the message via local Intergroup Representatives of local groups.

Many groups may ask why do we need an Intergroup Representative (IGR)? Because our local Treasure Valley Intergroup is here FOR YOU... the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous! Home groups are at the top of the pyramid structure of A.A., and this is WHY it is important for each registered group with the Central Office to have an I.G.R., to attend Intergroup monthly meetings so that Intergroup truly represents **as many groups as possible** when discussing events, the A.A. Hotline, Slippery When Wet Intergroup Newsletter, the Central Office operations, and the Intergroup website. Homegroups have their voice heard in all matters related to how Intergroup and the Central Office provide service to the fellowship, via the vote their I.G.R. carries at each Intergroup Monthly Meeting.

Keep going- 4 more miles along creek. You will cross the bridge. Take an immediate left and then immediate right on the trail that hugs the hill. Pass the first cabin and you are there!

Via Garden Valley: Hwy 55 to Banks


Right at Banks-Lowman Road. (hwy 17)

Go straight through Garden Valley. Turn Right on the Alder Creek Road. (If you get to the airport, you have gone too far.) Cross the bridge, then. in about a block turn Left. Dirt road the rest of the way. Drive along the South Fork of the Payette for 4 - 5 miles. You will see a Grimes Pass street sign and sign to Pioneerville, turn Right here onto Grimes Pass Road. (This road is steep, winding, and narrow, but not very long. Watch ahead and if a car is coming, there are places to pull over.) You do NOT need to have 4-wheel drive. You will see the sign at the Grimes Pass Summit - make a hairpin turn to the left. Come down the hill. You will come to the bridge and see a cabin on the right. Make a sharp right, before the bridge and another sharp right onto the trail that hugs the hill. Pass the first cabin, and you are there.



- Enter the number of gift certificates that you want and click the Buy button. (For multiple gift certificates, the discount will automatically be applied).
- ◆ Click Checkout and enter your order and payment information.
- When you click the Confirm button, you will get an order confirmation email and the gift certificate will be sent to you as an individual email. Forward the gift certificate to <u>Sonia Dominguez</u> at <u>sdominguez@aagrapevine.org</u> and we will redeem it for someone who has requested a subscription but can't afford one. (If you have purchased multiple gift certificates, select all of them and use the Forward as Attachment option, so you only have to send us one email).
- Note: Your information will not be connected to the subscription record and all renewal notices will be sent directly to the recipient.
