Acceptance

In Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) meetings around the world, people often talk about acceptance. This idea, along with the Serenity Prayer and many other words and sayings, is a big part of our recovery that anyone familiar with our 12-step program should recognize, some of these phrases come from the Big Book, while others are created and shared by AA members. Over time, these sayings have become well-known. One well-known saying is "Acceptance is the answer to ALL my problems today." Other phrases like "life on life's terms" have also become popular. For many years, these sayings were passed on by word of mouth at in-person meetings or included in new editions of the Big Book of AA. It's amazing how attending meetings can bring peace of mind as people in recovery share their experiences, creating new ways of healing together.

The "Acceptance" passage originally appeared in the third edition of the Big Book under the story title "Doctor, Alcoholic Addict." When the fourth edition was printed, the story was renamed "Acceptance is the Answer" because it was so often quoted. The author of this story, Dr. Paul O., was a doctor from California, who struggled with alcoholism and pill addiction. His wise words resonate with many in recovery, as they connect with a Higher Power and find the message they need. Even though Dr. Paul struggled with accepting himself, he wrote one of the most quoted passages in the Big Book. This passage has helped hundreds of thousands of people learn to accept their lives as they are. Acceptance creates a spiritual pause, allowing a Higher Power to enter and communicate with us, and through us, to help others who are still suffering, including ourselves.

We understand that by helping others, we also help ourselves. This reflects the teachings in the acceptance passage. Nothing in God's world happens by mistake. The Serenity Prayer is another valuable tool for increasing peace of mind, which grows stronger as we repeat it and share it with others. No one in AA has to face their problems alone. Members support each other in "living life on life's terms," with spirit, service, and love.

- The Conference Advisory Actions included recommendations for future conferences and literature development.

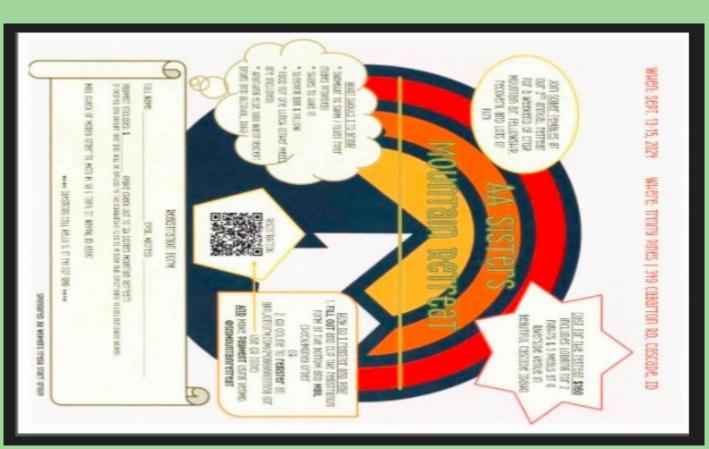
