





False Evidence Appearing Real

The Twelve Steps represent a transformative journey where we move from the darkness of addiction into the light of self-awareness, resilience, and freedom. In this process, we are not merely working to abstain but to profoundly reconnect with our true selves. Where addiction had once driven us into isolation, our work now guides us back toward a state of inner harmony and a life lived with intention and purpose.

One of the most pivotal stages in this journey occurs during the Fourth Step inventory, where we delve into the origins and expressions of our fears. Here, we are asked to acknowledge these fears honestly and to study them without judgment. For many, this is an unfamiliar task, one that may feel uncomfortable or even unnecessary at first. However, understanding the grip of our fears is essential. Through this, we begin to follow a path that allows us to replace a life dominated by anxiety and avoidance with one infused by surrender, connection, and love. I continue to work on my fears often as they pop up at the most inconvenient times. I'm not sure they ever go away entirely but I do know that surrendering them to my higher power and my sponsor, they begin to dissipate and I find that accepting each as it presents itself, helps me become more resilient, have more faith, and trust in those that that have journeyed through the process much longer than I.

It's common for people to achieve abstinence yet remain held back by cycles of fear. Why? Because abstaining from substances or behaviors alone doesn't address the emotional roots of our struggles. For true liberation, we must confront these fears directly. It's a profound undertaking but an essential one. Fear acts like a mirror, revealing where we're holding on, where we're still attached, and what growth lies ahead. This recognition isn't about eradicating fear but about transforming it into a tool for self-understanding. By leaning into this process, we cultivate not just resilience but a sense of clarity and strength that underpins lasting freedom. You can begin this work by reflecting on what challenges you fear most in your life at present. Remember, where there is resistance, there is often fear. Use it as a guide to illuminate where you are still clinging to old patterns or beliefs, and let it point the way to your next area of growth. Asking your higher power to join you in your reflection is one of the first steps to take in your recovery. I have had to work hard at trusting my higher power and allowing my faith to grow.

This work is the foundation of learning to be less self-serving and more spiritual. It is an investment in ourselves that will yield growth, clarity, and inner peace—a beautiful use of our time and energy. So, I encourage you to immerse yourself fully in your AA meetings, be of service, whether it be helping the staff at our Central Office (they can always use help), making coffee, greeting others as they arrive, setting up or down, getting to a meeting early so you can help and get to know others, and any daily practices you choose to participate in whether it is prayer, talking to your higher power, or however you wish to find more peace and spirituality. AA is a place where collective progress and genuine joy will flourish, and your presence adds to this growth. I'm genuinely grateful to walk this path with you.


