<u>Lessons Learned in AA: Building a Sober Life</u> <u>By: Lauri H., SWW Editor</u>

Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) is one of the most widely known recovery programs for individuals struggling with alcoholism. It is built around a structured, 12-step approach designed to guide participants through the process of personal growth, accountability, and long-term sobriety. Over my time in the program, I have gained invaluable insights about myself, others, and the way I engage with the world. Below are some of the most significant lessons I have learned in my journey.

Acceptance and Allowance

When I first encountered the concept of acceptance, I strongly disliked it. I thought acceptance meant agreeing with everything or staying silent when facing injustice, pain, or harm. Over time, I learned that true acceptance is about facing reality as it is, not as I wish it to be.

Acceptance does not mean passive resignation. Instead, it means acknowledging what I cannot change and taking meaningful action where I can. If something can be improved, I strive to effect change. If it cannot, I find peace in knowing I have done my best. As the AA "Big Book" suggests on page 417, acceptance is often the key to serenity.

Expectations

One of the most humbling lessons I have learned is that I cannot change other people, and even changing myself is a challenge. Many of us resist change, even when staying the same causes harm. We cling to unhealthy relationships, toxic environments, or self-destructive habits simply because they feel familiar. Much of this struggle comes from our expectations of others. We often assume people will treat us with kindness, fairness, or generosity because that is how we would treat them. Unfortunately, life rarely works out that way. When we rely too heavily on expectations, we set ourselves up for disappointment. Actor Anthony Hopkins, who has been sober for decades, offers a piece of wisdom I try to live by: "Expect nothing and appreciate everything." I am not there yet, but this mindset reminds me that recovery is about progress, not perfection.

Take What You Need, Leave the Rest

In recovery, not every idea, piece of advice, or approach will resonate — and that's okay. Over the years, I have encountered individuals with strong, even extreme, beliefs about what sobriety should look like. Some have insisted there is only one "true path" to recovery, while others have dismissed my experiences simply because they were different from theirs.

From these encounters, I have learned to focus on what is genuinely helpful and let go of what is not. Whether in meetings, therapy, or treatment, there will always be moments of disagreement or even frustration. The key is to keep an open mind without losing your sense of self.

The Role of Purpose and Work: Being Of Service

One practical insight I've learned through both experience and observation is the importance of having a sense of purpose. Data shows that about 70% of individuals who remain sober long-term create structure, stability, and meaning in their lives. These are all essential for sustained recovery.

The Value of Humor

Finally, I've discovered that laughter is a powerful tool in recovery. Learning to laugh at myself and find humor even in difficult situations helps me maintain perspective. If I cannot laugh during the hard times, it becomes nearly impossible to experience joy when life improves. Humor doesn't erase pain, but it makes the journey lighter and more hopeful.

In Case of Errors or Questions About Your Electronic Transfers, Statement, or Bill and Your Rights

If you think your statement or bill is wrong, or if you need more information about a transaction on your statement or bill, write us on a separate theet of paper at P.O. Box 2469, Pocatello, ID 832/06. We must hear from you so later than 60 days after we sent you the FIRST statement or bill on which the error or problem appeared. You can call us at 1-800-456-5087, but daina sa will not preserve your rights. In your letter, give us the following information:

- Your name and account number.
- The dollar amount of the suspected error. Describe the error and explain, if you can, why you believe there is an error. If you need more information, describe the item in question.

We will investigate your complaint and will credit any error promptly. If we take more than 10 business days to do this, we will credit your account for the amount you think is in error, so you will have the use of the money during the time it takes us to complete our investigation. You do not have to pay any amount in question while we are investigating, but you are still obligated to pay the parts of your statement or bill that are not in question. While we investigate your question, we cannot report you as delinquent, or take any action to collect the amount in question.

Special Rule for Visa Card Purchases If you have a problem with the quality of goods or services you purchased with a Vise card, and you have tried in good faith to correct the problem with the merchant, you may not have to pay the remaining amount due on the goods or services. You will have this protection only when the purchase price was more than \$50 and the purchase was made in your home state or within 100 miles of your mailing address. (If we own or operate the merchant, or if we mailled you the advertisement for the property or services, all purchases are covered regardless oil amount or location of purchase.)

Open Meeting - open at 6:05 pm with the Serenity Prayer

A Declaration of Unity - This we owe to A.A.'s future; to place our common welfare first; to keep our Fellowship united. For on A.A. unity depend our lives, and the lives of those to come.

Attendees - Doug, Jen, Lisa, Ryan, Kimmie, Richard and Teri

Election of Officers - none at this time

Secretary Report - July 8, 2025 minutes approved.

Reports

- Teri, accountant, presented the July 2025 financial report. Highlights are as follows:
 Receipts including sales = \$19,310.99 (includes 7th Tradition contributions in the amount of \$2,998.45);
 Total expenses = \$18,066.61; July net cash = \$1,244.38; cash available for operations = \$24,698.47 (plus \$20,209.65 Operations Prudent Reserve and \$11,000 Literature Prudent Reserve). Inventory on Hand = \$25,332.86. Please see July 2025 financial report for full details.
- Intergroup Chair: Ryan P. reported the Lefty River Float went well. Kimmie P. stated attendance = 50-70 people, venue cost = \$140; food & supplies cost = approx. \$310; after contributions & raffle, net loss = approx. \$60; people seemed to enjoy themselves.
- Intergroup Treasurer: Kimmie P. reported Intergroup checking account balance ending 7/31/25 = \$771.87. Savings account balance = \$25.00. No income or expenses reflected.
- Intergroup Co-Chair: Richard T. reported he attended the Lefty River Float to grill food. He has received no
 feedback concerning Sept. 14th National Sobriety Day. Since this is not an A.A. function, no further action will be
 taken at this time. Ryan suggested this topic be taken back to Intergroup to consider for next year.
- Store Report: Jen L. reported she visited the store to sign checks. Please see New Business for additional store matters.

Steering Committee District Representatives Reports

- District 3 Representative: Position vacant.
- District 4 Representative: Doug P. reported he attended the district's business meeting to inform them a new Steering Committee rep. will be needed effective 1/1/26. Nominee(s) to be presented in September. District 4 is searing up for the Unity Day Picnic.
- District 5 Representative: Jen L. reported all subcommittees are staffed to support the Unity Day Pienic. 150+ tickets have been sold so far with more tickets available at the event. Speaker meetings will be held in the senior center in the park – Archives will be present. District elections will be held in October
- District 8 Representative: Lisa S. reported district elections will take place this fall. This next month will be busy
 reviewing the agenda items for the fall assembly. One of the agenda items pertains to funding area officers to
 attend PRAASA.
- District 9 Representative: Position vacant.

Old Business

- Doug spoke with an employee at T-Mobile. He will go to a T-Mobile store to confirm they can provide 5-G
 capacity with 100-speed internet capability. Doug will continue to work on this.
- Doug inquired about adding Kim to the CenturyLink account. Teri recommended that Doug call CenturyLink and add Kim as an authorized owner. This will enable Kim to resolve phone issues and process automatic payments.

No business was conducted between the July and August 2025 Steering Committee business meeting.

New Business

- Central Office to host a chili feed on Saturday, September 13th from 11 2 pm. Cost = approx. \$75. Slow moving store merchandise will be placed on sale. Doug and Lisa will attend to answer questions concerning TVICO.
- The Southwest Idaho Community Center in Nampa is hosting a Recovery Rally 2025 on Sept. 27th at Lakeview Park. CPC/PI will have a booth at the event, but Central Office will not accept the invitation to attend and sale store merchandise—this is not an A.A. event.
- Request to add Robert R. as a vetted volunteer. Robert is a dedicated volunteer and has been of service to Central
 Office. This will allow Robert to be alone in the store when an employee has work errands to run or attend a
 personal appointment. Robert will not operate the cash register. Request is approved.
- Central Office has not been invited to attend the fall 2025 assembly in Burley (Oct 3rd 5rd). Central Office has made calls to the planning committee over the last couple of weeks, but the calls have not been returned. The Steering Committee voted not to send Central Office to the assembly.
- Central Office received an offer to purchase T-shirts from an individual. The store has customers who request T-shirts. Discussion about purchasing small inventory vs. accepting pre-orders. Decision reached to have store employees conduct survey with customers for their feedback. Jen will work with Kim on whether pre-orders are an option.
- Teri ordered QuickBooks Online at an annual cost = \$180 (current QuickBooks Desktop costs \$1,600/year).
 Current server will be discontinued. A training video will be purchased to help the store employees, cost = \$350.
 Teri's computer expert will go to the store and finalize the network connection, cost = \$250 \$350.
 Teri's fee = \$150 for the enhanced payroll subscription.
 Teri to provide analyses of the current/old costs vs. the new costs.

 members will consist of the Intergroup reps. until new Steering Committee members can be voted in.
